However, we continue to be concerned that Enn Tarto remains in prison. We are encouraged by your policies of glasnost and perestroika, but are concerned that these policies have still not benefited people such as Enn Tarto. We urge you to personally review his case and hope that he will soon be released from prison and allowed to freely practice his religion and continue his human rights activities.

Thank you for your time and cooperation and we look forward to your response.
